



Class A CDL Driver Job Description

Essential Requirements for CDL Drivers include but are not limited to:

- Maintain a Class A CDL Driver's license with excellent driving history
- Drive trucks, and other vehicles requiring a CDL
- Follow applicable safety rules, regulations, guidelines, polices and site specific safety plans.
- Load and unload equipment from vehicles and trailers
- Communicate with company mechanic to ensure that equipment is maintained, repaired and in maximum operation condition
- Complete required paperwork, forms and records as required (Truck Inspection Reports, Daily Logs, Fuel Logs, etc)
- Pass pre-employment Drug Screening
- Can lift 75lbs
- Have own steel toed safety boots
- Valid State Driver's License
- Reliable Phone
- Your own Transportation
- Criminal Background Check
- Motor Vehicle Records Check
- Department of Transportation physical exam.

Candidates must have a minimum of three years of verifiable experience operating a vehicle requiring a CDL, be at least 21 years of age and legally eligible to work in the United States, and must be able to speak and read English well enough to converse with the general public, understand highway traffic and signals, respond to official questions, and be able to make legible entries on reports and records.

Construction industry experience, heavy equipment operation and maintenance experience a plus.

The work environment at a potential or actual project location is usually dirty, dusty, noisy, and is subject to inclement or extreme weather conditions. Work may require use of personal protective equipment. Frequent travel is required and the applicant must be available for emergency response work after-hours and on weekends.
